

National Qualifications 2020-21: Initial Overview

Working within SQA guidelines, it is clear that internal assessments carried out this year during class time in school will play a key part in providing evidence. Teachers will use these to make reliable judgements of attainment for individual pupils in the graded courses (A-D) as detailed below.

National 5

There are no National 5 SQA external exams or coursework submissions this year.

Grades **will be** awarded this year according to **teacher judgements** which will be based on a range of evidence. These judgements will be quality assured. Modifications to courses have been published for subject areas, accessible through the <u>SQA</u> website.

Evidence to be gathered

assessment resources will include:

- Holistic assessments ('prelim' type activity)
- Internal assessments (class tests)
- Coursework
- Homework

Higher / Adv Higher

H/AH Exams are scheduled to take place as normal between 13th May and 4th June 2021.

Completion of coursework is still required in some subjects however many have been modified by SQA. Modifications have been published for specific subject areas and can be accessed through the SQA website.

Contingency arrangements



Should teachers be asked to provide attainment judgements in the event of exams being removed for H or AH courses then we will rely on the same evidence gathering as outlined for N5 courses.

Predictive strength of evidence

SQA advise that the focus should be on **Quality** of evidence rather than Quantity.

The strongest evidence of attainment will come from performance in the Holistic Assessments and Internal assessments completed under controlled conditions in school.

Students will complete holistic assessments (prelim type activity) in classrooms this session and undertake class assessments at appropriate times to provide indicators of progress in knowledge and understanding within courses in preparation for sitting the final externally assessed exam.

The year ahead

For all students sitting certificated courses this session whether it be N5, Higher or Advanced Higher, it is crucial that all must give their best efforts to maximise achievement in all of the assessment opportunities provided across the whole school year.

The assessment resources described above provide opportunities for all to shine and for a holistic judgement to be made by teachers, where required, of each individual students level of achievement in any course.







Bathgate Academy Learner Evidence Journey 2020-21.

SQA Assessment Timeline 2020-21

Following guidance from SQA, Bathgate Academy has identified the following sources of evidence as crucial in supporting teachers to make accurate and fair judgements of grades achieved by pupils in N5/H/AH certificated courses this year where required. SQA have indicated that the evidence provided from engaging in these assessment hold different weightings, with assessments held under strict exam conditions providing the most reliable indicator of performance



Holistic Assessments

- In class holistic assessments:
 This year all pupils will have 2 opportunities to sit formal assessments under controlled SQA exam conditions.
- When:

Holistic Assessment window 1: November 30th - December 17th.

Holistic Assessment window 2: April/May 2021 - to be confirmed.

• How:

Assessment takes place during class time. Departments will provide further information on content covered by assessments. Pupils will know when these assessments will occur within each window.



Internal Assessments

- Class tests, A/B tests:
 These assessments cover shorter pieces of work and therefore hold lower weighting as evidence for SQA judgements.
- Assessments can be undertaken at any point across the year when units of

across the year when units of work have been completed and teachers feel pupils have been well prepared

• How:

When:

Assessment takes place during class time at teacher's discretion. Teachers will provide pupils at least 1 weeks notice of upcoming assessments.



 Project work: In some subjects, pupils are required to complete practically based project work.

- Folio work: In some subjects, pupils are required to complete folios / write essays to evidence their knowledge and understanding.
- When: Ongoing across the year

 How: In class time or at home dependant on SQA guidelines.



Homework/Classwork

• Preparatory work:

Work undertaken throughout the year in school will be supplemented with any work undertaken digitally as a result of Covid-19 circumstances. This may have some influence on attainment judgements made by teachers at the end of each course.

- When: Ongoing across the year
- How:

Pupils will build evidence of work overtaken in their coursework jotters. Digital records will be kept by pupils via teams of evidence they have produced.



Holistic assessments: November 30th to December 17th 2020.

This year all pupils in S4-6 will sit two holistic assessments for each course under formal exam conditions. As you should already be aware, the first diet of these assessments will take place during the last three weeks of term.

Due to COVID restrictions, these assessments will take place in your usual classrooms during your normal period times. Since these are formal assessments, the conditions in the classroom will be the same as those in SQA exams. This means that you should arrive on time, have all of the equipment needed and hand in your phone to your class teacher. Your phone cannot be used as a calculator.


